## Background:

### **Purpose of role:**

The Full Stack Developer is a key role within the technology team in the Digital Media department. As a Full Stack Developer you will be responsible for writing code across the whole stack - providing input and feedback on our designs, the coding standards and the architecture, deployment and roadmap.

As well as creating software, building products and writing code, you will be a visible member of our team, often presenting at our fortnightly showcases, meeting with stakeholders and representing the Digital Media team within organisation and externally, too.

## **Main Responsibilities**

- Support development of the front- and back-end technology stack for vam.ac.uk
- Drive modern digital best practices within the tech team
- Prioritise our approach to reducing technical debt before it becomes a problem

You will do this by:

- working on front end website code
- practicing agile, lean and TDD
- using a suite of tools including AWS, CircleCI, Marvel, and Zeplin

## Skills:

The ideal candidate will demonstrate:

- solid understanding of modern development principles
- excellent knowledge of Ruby, Rails, PHP, Javascript, React, ES6
- excellent understanding of design, accessibility and responsiveness
- excellent knowledge of backend systems including Postgres, MySQL, Ubuntu, Suse Linux

## Experience:

You will demonstrate:

- experience of developing websites at scale using cloud hosting, CDNs and caching.
- experience working in an ecommerce environment would be valuable, as would understanding the importance of page speed and SEO

## You will also:

You should also be comfortable thinking of full stack development not only in terms of front and back end but also from prototyping to launch, analytics, a/b testing and performance monitoring.

- Demonstrate strong problem solving skills to implement the right approach and make effective use of resources.
- Be comfortable working in a diverse team
- Approach problems as challenges, valuing finding a solution over finding blockers
- Keen to learn and share knowledge with the wider team
