This is an excellent opportunity to apply your experience in health and housing advice pathways within the Criminal Justice System to support resettlement and deliver effective action plans. You will receive mandatory training from the prison, Thames Valley CRC and Milton Keynes College to become a case management practitioner.

As a successful **Resettlement Case Worker**, you will work alongside the housing and healthcare teams to support resettlement through the Thames Valley Community Rehabilitation Services for prisoners entering and leaving custody. As the **Case Manager**, you will use motivational goal setting skills to support service user participation and develop new services, in partnership with the existing providers.

The Resettlement team provides, coordinates and allocates through the gate (TTG) sentence plans for prisoners who are entering or preparing for release into the community. We complete the online records associated with their sentence planning and manage a caseload of prisoners, tracking agreed milestones and planning interventions around employment, health, accommodation or education and support resettlement.

HMPPS Woodhill is a core local prison currently housing both remand and sentenced prisoners of all categories. It is part of the High Security Estate and will become a Category B training prison in the near future. The Education department works closely with prison colleagues to ensure the courses delivered are relevant to the prisoners' complex needs, rehabilitation and resettlement.

Courses include: English and Maths Functional Skills (Entry 1 – Level 2), ICT, Art, Music Technology, Food Safety, Health and Safety and a wide range of personal and social development courses. Vocational courses consist of Catering and Hospitality, Painting and Decorating and Kitchen Fitting and Tiling. There is a high take-up of Open University and Distance Learning courses. Over 120 entries have been submitted for the Koestler competition and last year we received 3 Gold, 4 highly commended and 4 commended awards.


Our department believes the opportunities provided for our learners will help to address their offending behaviour and give them the skills to enhance their lives and gain employment on release.
