


Introduction

About the role

Make no mistake, this is a management role with immense professional opportunity. Looking after a range of designated sites and making sure they deliver for nature - you'll have a business to run, which has unique conservation challenges. Carngafallt has ancient wood pasture with veteran trees and oak-dominated Celtic rainforest, Gwenffrwd-Dinas is a large reserve with more than 600 hectares of sweeping upland, lowland farmland and verdant Atlantic Oak Woodland. You will also be responsible for our woodland reserves in the Mawddach Valley and an urban fringe site at Cwm Clydach.

You'll know exactly how to get the very best out of everyone and how best to support and motivate Site Wardens and Volunteers and you'll know how to work with a range of specialists within and outside of the RSPB. You'll have budgets to manage and evolve, management plans to develop and implement. And plenty of exciting and rewarding challenges along the way. It's definitely no small task but one huge career opportunity.

The reserves are separated by a significant distance which will require working from a home base in a suitably central location.



About you

You'll be an inspiration to the team; creative, bright and on the ball, focused on getting things done to the highest standards. You'll have ambition.

You need to be able to create a vision and provide direction, energy and capability to the team who support you. Because we are a charity, every penny we spend needs to maximise the outcome for nature. So, you must be able to drive and direct work across a significant landholding. We identify where birds and wildlife are most under threat, then act decisively and with commitment to save them and deliver tangible results.


Supportive
