Experience teaching other subjects would be beneficial but not essential, support would be given to develop in other subject areas alongside the Maths delivery, as long as you have a passion for teaching and a willingness to develop.

Many of the learners have a diverse range of needs and learning abilities, they will often have had a negative experience with education.
