- Carry out data protection impact assessments and Article 30 processing records as required and support teams to ensure that 'privacy by design' is core to the delivery and operation of all services
- Ensure data processing agreements are in place with all those who process data on behalf of MK College Group and data sharing agreements are in place with all those organisations that MK College Group shares data
- Implement best practice in privacy management ensuring that a 'privacy by design' approach is embedded into new services and projects
- Design solutions for privacy risks that you have identified and assessed, and ensure these are developed in collaboration with the MK College Group Strategic Leadership Team
- Work with teams and specialist risk consultants as they create risk assessment reports and risk treatment plans
- Provide training and awareness to ensure that all colleagues understand and meet both the MK College Group's and their own data protection obligations and responsibilities
- Ensure incident management plans remain current, coordinate action plans in response to any personal data breaches and provide support for incident handing and reporting of personal data breaches
- Monitor compliance with data protection requirements and risks on an ongoing basis and undertake periodic audits and assessments
- Act as the main point of contact for the Information Commissioner's Office and other supervisory authorities and regulators as appropriate
